The Witness Commission is excited to announce our 2018 Friend-to-Friend event. This year's event will be held on Wednesday, December 12th, from 3:30-5:30pm at the Hall.

We welcome your participation in the event; please see someone on the Witness Commission if you have questions and/or want to get involved.

The idea of Friend-to-Friend is to give "no strings attached" grocery vouchers to folks in our community who are struggling. Figuring out who could use some help was an issue so we went to the community service board and they agreed to invite some clients. Because of confidentiality, we do not know personal information (phone numbers or addresses). During the Friend-to-Friend event, we have the opportunity to meet and talk informally with individuals these while enjoying refreshments. We give them a voucher for Sharp Shopper (\$50 or \$100 - no alcohol or tobacco is sold there).

We do not preach or evangelize, but we do tell them about our services and welcome them – we basically show them that we care. We are trying to live out the gospel and live out what Jesus has called us to do – simply, peacefully and together.

Paradise Community, CA, COB Update

Brethren Disaster Ministries has issued a report on the devastating wildfire that has destroyed the town of Paradise, Calif., and claimed many lives. Funds have been established to assist the recovery. Here are excerpts from the report:

"Within the Church of the Brethren, many have been concerned about the fate of residents in Paradise, Calif., and its surrounding areas. Special concern has expressed for Pastor been Melvin Campbell and the members of Paradise Church of the Brethren, [whose meeting house] was completely destroyed by the wildfire which rushed through town. Pastor Campbell and his wife, Jane, were able to evacuate just ahead of the fire but left everything behind when they fled.

"Brethren Disaster Ministries is working closely with the Pacific Southwest District to respond to the fire. PSWD is collecting funds to provide direct support to Pastor Campbell and members of the Paradise Church of the Brethren. Contributions, noted as for the 'Paradise Fire', can be sent to Pacific SW District Church of the Brethren (PSWD COB), PO Box 219, La Verne, CA 91750.

"BDM's Children's Disaster Services has deployed volunteers to serve in a Disaster Recovery Center in Chico, Calif., providing childcare to families seeking assistance. BDM is communicating with PSWD and other partner agencies to determine how it can respond in the long-term in Paradise and surrounding areas affected by the Camp Fire. Donations to support CDS' deployment and BDM's response can be made, noting that it is for the 'Camp Fire Response', to Emergency Disaster Fund, Church of the Brethren, 1451 Dundee Ave., Elgin, IL 60120."

Young Adult Ministry

About two years ago Montezuma attempted a young adult Sunday school class - which was fruitful for a short time, but was overall released due to a number of reasons. Although the class was 'let go of,' I have not 'let go of' my passion for young adult ministry. Through the Bible there are plenty of references to the faithfulness and spiritual commitment of young people. In fact, most of the twelve disciples themselves were arguably young adults, if not under the age of 20! Regardless, research shows that young adults today attend traditional style churches least, but are still as curious and hungry for spiritual and faith formation as any other generation. In fact, young adults who choose to be active in church are even more likely than older adults to be interested in Bible study, prayer, and spiritual growth (Ministry with Young Adults, Steve Clapp, p. 57). So what is Montezuma doing about this?

I am excited for a young adult Sunday school class to start again. In December, Pastor David will be hosting conversation, Bible study, etc. for young adults who choose to come after worship. This is not all that is happening. Like we learned two years ago, there needs to be more available. After all, young adults are not just looking for a 'class.' They are looking for ways the church is investing in them, and making sure the church cares. A small group ministry is being planned for interested young adults, and so is a monthly contemporary service.

These are opportunities for our church, and will need support from all generations if we want to reach out to this age group. A small group ministry will help young adults connect to one another, give one another accountability and support, and help one another in their personal, spiritual, and faith The contemporary service will meet formation. some more needs that came out of a conversation I had with young adults. The service will not replace Sunday morning worship. This service will be open to anyone who is interested for a relaxed atmosphere, engaging discussion around scripture, and perhaps even some new styles of worship music. You can be on the lookout for information regarding these things in the new year.

Join with many others into an endless circle of giving that stretches around the world making lasting change possible. The Upward Way SS class appreciates your support of this project.


