In-Person, Public Worship Service June 21

Father's Day at the Ballpark

Montezuma Church will hold an in-person, public worship service Sunday, June 21, 9:30 a.m., at the Montezuma Braves baseball field. The outdoor service offers the safest way to end the three-month disruption of regular weekly worship services since the Coronavirus pandemic forced a halt to those services in mid-March.

The simple outdoor service will highlight Father's Day in a setting that is both close to the congregation's meeting house and that offers numerous options for seating. Worshipers may fine a place on one of the bleacher benches, a dug out, bring a lawn chair, or remain in their car for the service. The baseball PA system will be used for the service so worship will be a community affair. Masks are encouraged when moving around the ballpark to find your seat, but once you are comfortably, and safely distanced, in your seat, the outdoor setting will option of being mask-free. Unfortunately, we cannot offer popcorn or cracker jacks.

In the event of rain, a brief service will be held in the Ruritan pavilion next to the ballpark. Montezuma is moving toward a return to sanctuary services later this summer. These details will be forthcomina.

2020 Annual Conference Cancelled

The 2020 Annual Conference scheduled for July 1-5 in Grand Rapids, MI, has been cancelled. All of the business – including Compelling Vision discussions and ballots for elections – is being pushed back to 2021 at the Greensboro, NC, conference. To this point, Montezuma had paid \$629 in registration fees for the conference and will donate approximately half that amount to the conference to support its ongoing expenses.
