Two responses are planned. First, a drop-in reception on Sunday October 18 from 2 to 4 p.m. at Montezuma Hall. Because of Covid-19, a large inside gathering is not possible. The reception will include pre-wrapped treats and people can either drive by, or park and get out of their cars for a short visit.
