Montezuma has benefited from the caring and creative ministry of Pastor Gabe Dodd for five years. Now we prepare to wish Gabe, his wife Pam and son Elias, blessings as they move to the Hagerstown, Maryland, community where Gabe will pastor the Beaver Creek Church of the Brethren. Gabe's last Sunday at Montezuma is November 1.

During the course of these next two months, Pastor Gabe plans to reach out to us for farewell conversations. These types of conversations are an important part of ministry. They allow us to express our appreciation to Gabe for his ministry at Montezuma and to remember our interactions with him and the specific ways that he's touched our lives. They will also be important conversations for Gabe. He wants to talk with us and share his own reflections on his time here at Montezuma and the lasting relationships he's formed with us. Sadly, the reality of Covid-19 cramps our lives and relationships. What would have been a series of home visits for Gabe will most likely be many phone conversations. Hart is a minister and teacher who often worships with a Church of the Brethren congregation in Harrisburg, PA. Hart reflects on his life experience as a Christian and a black person to talk about race and the church. The book is available at the church for no cost. On Thursday evening a Bible study group (Sept. 10) meets at 7. Barbara Moyer and David Miller will lead this study based on A Guide for Biblical Studies, which is typically used in our adult Sunday School classes and that resource is likewise available at the church.
