Montezuma Partners with District in Ministry Internship

The Shenandoah District and Montezuma will partner in providing experience and training for a ministry student. Pending approval of the Church Board, Karl Magenhofer will start an internship with Montezuma early in the summer. This program aims to provide 200 hours of supervised experience to Karl in most areas of pastoral ministry. Given that Karl works fulltime with WSVA Radio, the plan is for him to work ten hours a week over a five-month period. Further details and information will be forthcoming.
