Glick and Wyrick to serve as Interim Pastors

J.D. Glick and Ron Wyrick will share interim pastoral responsibilities in the coming months. Their term of service begins in mid-November. Generally, J.D. will preach the first two Sundays of each month and Ron the latter two Sundays of the month. At this point, Wednesday is the day they plan to have office hours – 9 a.m. to noon, or longer – with J.D. taking the first half of the month and Ron the latter. They will provide pastoral care in hospital or emergency situations, anointings, and memorial services. Church Deacons will provide support to home bound members. J.D. will work with the Church Board.

Among other congregations, both have pastored the Harrisonburg First Church of the Brethren, and J.D. was the founding pastor of the Sunrise congregation.
