Worship and Communion October 3

Montezuma Deacons will provide communion in the pews during morning worship, Sunday, October 3. Deacons had planned to hold the first Love Feast since the fall of 2019, but spikes in Covid-19 infections over the last month forced them to re-evaluate those plans. Communion will include recently made Montezuma communion bread that will be wrapped and distributed individually as worshippers enter the sanctuary.

Fall Church Business Meeting is November 7

Montezuma will meet for its fall business meeting at 11:30 a.m., Sunday, November 7. The meeting will include calling leadership for 2022, approving the 2022 budget, and a decision about the church windows. A packet of reports, YTD 2021 financials, the proposed 2022 budget, and slate of leaders will be available to the congregation by Sunday, October 31.

District Conference Downsized; Meets November 6

The Shenandoah District Conference is being downsized from its Friday/Saturday format to a Saturday morning event. Worries about public health during the pandemic forced district leaders to take these cautionary measures. In a statement District Executive John Jantzi wrote: "A decision was made to hold a delegate-only meeting . . . on Saturday morning, November 6. Our time together on 'District Conference Saturday' will include worship, a few reports and business agenda items including the adoption of the slate and the proposed 2022 District Budget." This meeting will be held at the Rockingham County Fairgrounds in the Display Barn. Montezuma delegates are Don McNett, Ramona Evans, Mary Frances Heishman, Dorita Webster, and David Miller.

The cancellation of Friday's conference activities means that Montezuma will not be hosting any part of the conference this year. Montezuma was scheduled to host a meal for pastors in the early evening and then a worship service to kick-off the conference later at 7 p.m. This marks the second year that Montezuma hosting the conference has been canceled due to the pandemic.

Modified Heritage Festival this October

While we are unable to hold a traditional Heritage festival, Montezuma still plans to have a good time working together this month to provide the delicious food that the public demands! We plan to make apple butter Saturday, October 9, at the Montezuma Hall. Plus, we will prepare and sell BBQ chicken, ham sandwiches, white beans, vegetable soup, donuts, and baked goods. Apple butter from the 9th will be available to purchase. It will be a good time. CROP Walk November 7


