- 1 fingernail or toenail clipper
- 1 bath-size bar of soap in the original package
- 1 toothbrush in the original package
- 10 standard size Band-Aids

Do not add any extra items or toothpaste. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each kit just prior to its final journey. Cash donations are welcome as well, to offset shipping costs or adding items that are in short supply.
